The sergeant, at considerable risk to his job, resolved to make no report upon the case, so that no court proceedings would result. The landlady offered a month's free board until he should get upon his feet again. While I, making perhaps the least contribution, came forward with seven pounds ten shillings for him to put back in the office safe.

11-15. Read the story and answer the questions that follow.

(1x5=5)

Once upon a time a daughter complained to her father that her life was miserable and she didn't know how she was going to make it. She was tired of fighting and struggling all the time. Her father, a chef, took her to the kitchen. He filled three pots with water and placed each on a high fire. Once the three pots began to boil he placed potatoes in one pot, eggs in the second pot and ground coffee beans in the third pot. He then let them sit and boil without saying a word to his daughter. After twenty minutes, he turned off the burners. He took the potatoes and eggs out and placed them in a bowl. He then ladled the coffee out and placed it in a cup.

He asked her to touch the potatoes. She did and noted that they were soft. He then asked her to take an egg and break it. After pulling off the shell, she observed the hard-boiled egg. Finally, he asked her to sip the coffee. Its rich aroma brought a smile to her face. He then explained that the potatoes, the eggs and coffee beans had each faced the same adversity - the boiling water. However, each one reacted differently. The potato was strong and hard, but in boiling water it became soft and weak. The egg was fragile with thin outer shell, but in boiling water inside of the egg became hard. But the coffee bean had changed the water and created something new.

"Which one are you?" - he asked his daughter, "In life, things happen around us, but the only thing that truly matters is how you choose to react to it and what you make out of it."
